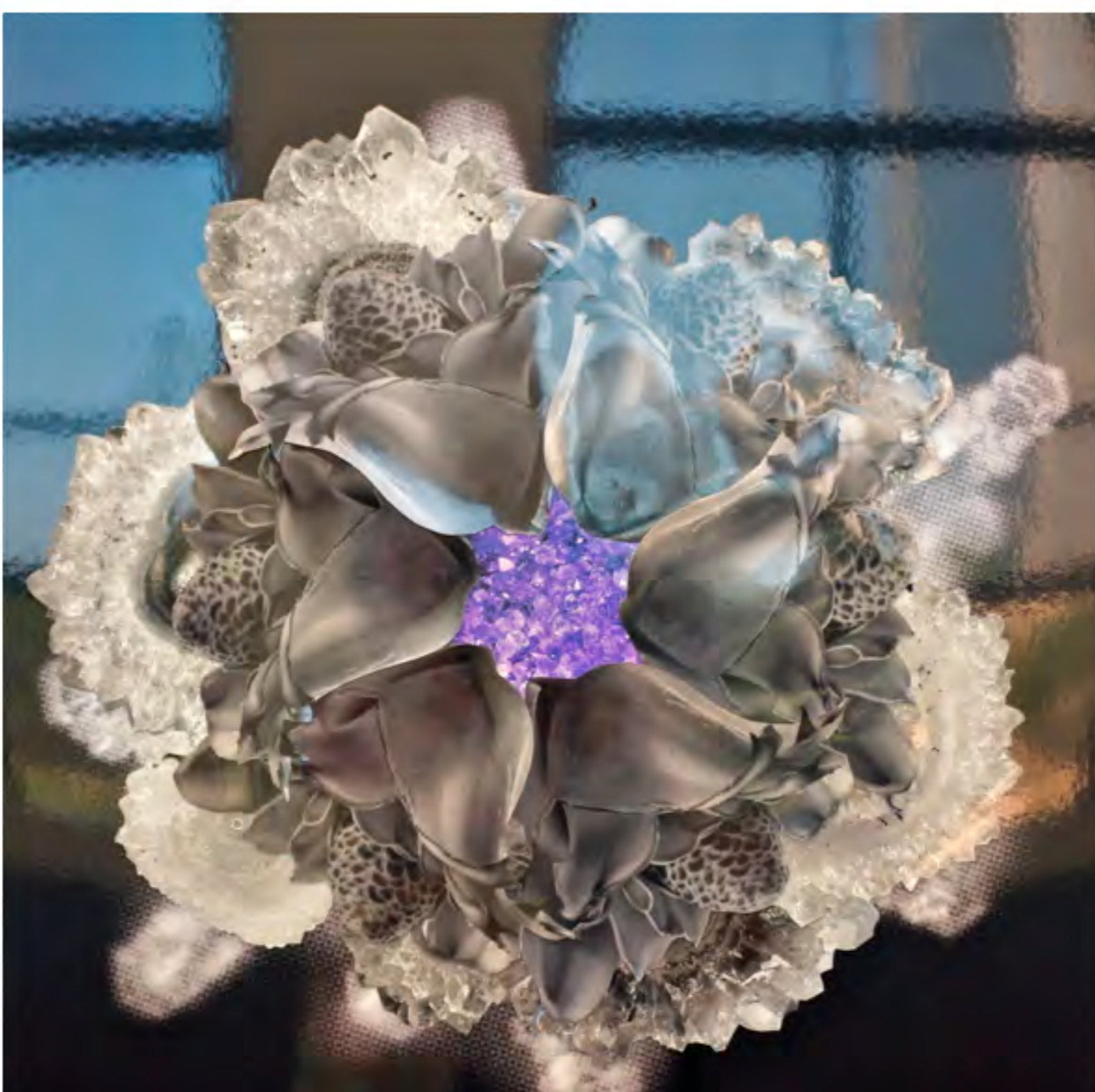
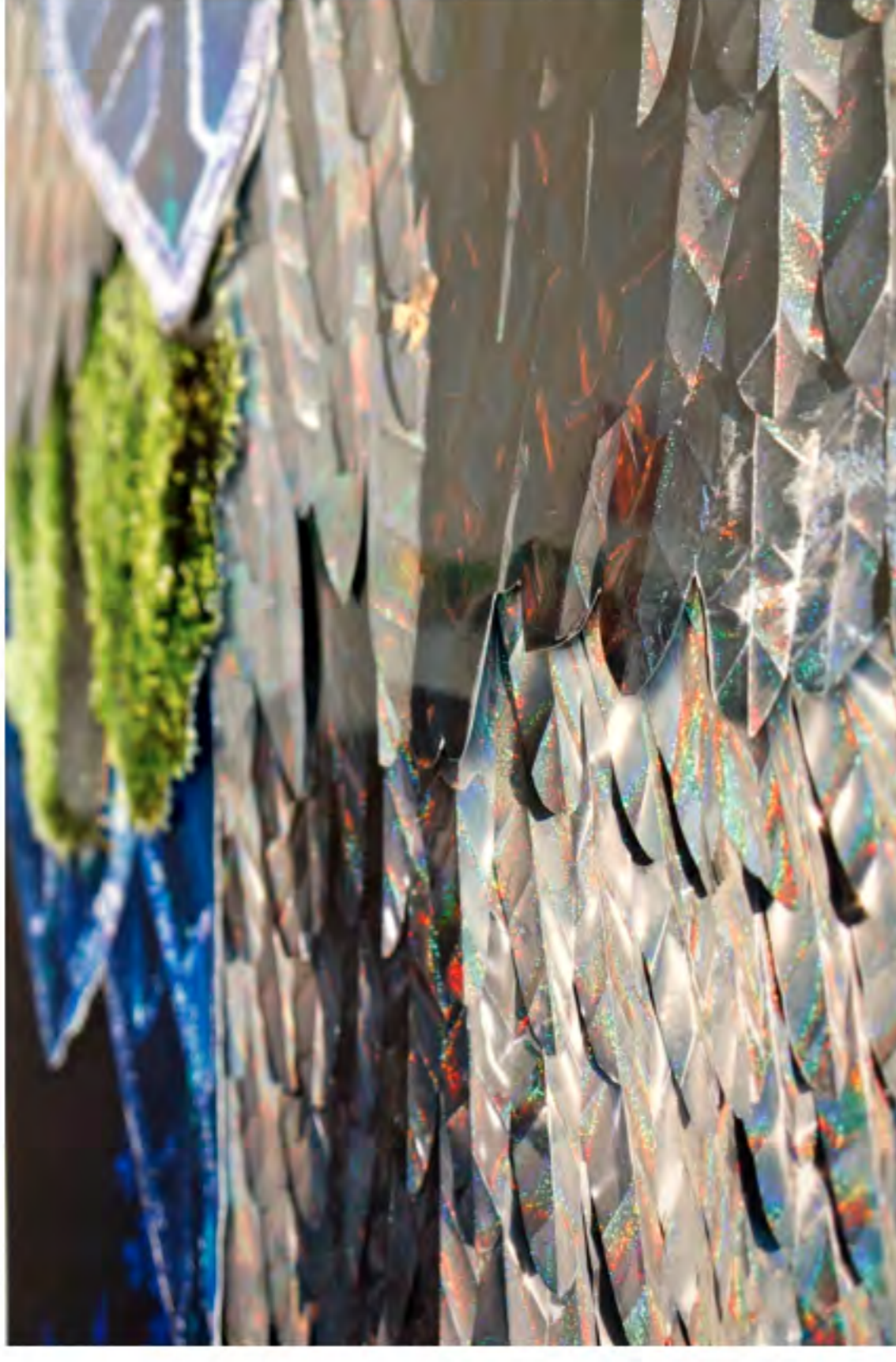
Day 191 of my challenge to be more Brazilian, Chicago edition, I was able to admire the works of a Brazilian artist.

"Mist of the Earth" renders the Brazilian rainforest in a series of textured, multilayered photo-collages that breeds surreal imagery, yet draws you into the vibrant colors, exotic wildlife and the chaos that is the rainforest.
